

InsectInventorium Do It Yourself!

This is a simple 4-step guide to inventing new insects with your community of children.



Step 1 Collect Fallen Material



Take a walk outside with the children to collect fallen leaves, branches, pods, seeds, etc.



Do ensure younger children are supervised as small items may be choking hazards.

Use some real insects as reference for the children and have a conversation about what they know. Or use the fallen material to spark curiosity - which part of an insect might this leaf be? How about this pod?

Bring in information about real insects to spark their imagination, from books or videos. Encourage the children to move like insects or read about the most surprising characteristics of insects too.

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Step 3 Making the Insect



Provide each child with an A3 sized surface to make their insects on, eg. cardstock paper, construction paper, etc, and give them access to the fallen material that they collected earlier.



Let the children choose what they would like to use to make their insect.

Step 4 Create the Insect's Story And Movement





Guide the children in coming up with the life of the insect:

- 1.Insect's name
- 2. Insect's scientific name (older kids)
- 3. Where it lives;
- 4. What it eats; diet
- 5. How it moves
- 6.One interesting fact about the insect

These can be written down or recorded by the children or teachers.
